Such Information is reliable if the practitioner or provider has personal knowledge of the person's disability and is acting within the scope of his or her practice to provide the supporting information.
- 5. Information from any other source that the housing provider reasonably determines to be reliable in accordancewith the federalFair Housing Act and s. 504 of the RehabilitationAct of 1973.
- Documentation that reasonably supports the person's need for the particular emotional support animal being requested. Supporting information may include:
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- Whether the animal's presence otherwise violates individuals' right to peace and quiet enjoyment;and
- Whether the animal is housebroken or is unable to live with others in a reasonable manner. The individual must provide written consent for SAS to disclose information regarding the requester and presence of the assistance nimal to those individuals who may be impacted by the presence of the animal including, but not limited to, Housing personne and potential and/or actual noommate(s)/neighbor(s) uchinformation shall be limited to information related to the animal and shall not include information related to the individual's disability. FAU reserves the right assignant individual with an assistance nimal to a single room without a roommate upon availability.
